## 1. Project Background

To face the challenges of the 21<sup>st</sup> century, the Government of Bangladesh with the help of international development financing agencies has undertaken a series of structural reform programs in its development activities. As part of development works, the Bangladesh Government and the World Bank jointly implementing a five year long “Dhaka City Neighborhood Upgrading Project” (DCNUP, the Project). The Dhaka South City Corporation (DSCC), under the Local Government Division of the Ministry of Local Government, Rural Development and Cooperatives, is the implementing agency of the project. Dhaka city accounts for about one-fifth of the country's gross domestic product (GDP) and half of formal employment. The mega city also plays an important role in achieving the government's vision of upper-middle income country. Dhaka is one of the world's most densely populated cities. Due to inadequate infrastructure, lack of public amenities and severe traffic congestion, the residents face many difficulties in their everyday lives. The project will cater to the differentiated needs of women and children, elderly and disabled. Women in Dhaka face challenges in terms of mobility, walkability and access to public infrastructure. To improve personal safety and access for women, children and elderly, the project will ensure safe-pleasant mobility, energy-efficient street lighting, Community Center, Green Building, Traffic improvement, and other integrated amenities. The project will also help to enhance green open spaces by improving selected parks, streets and waterfront areas of 4 (four) Neighborhoods of Dhaka: (i) Kamrangirchar; (ii) Lalbagh; (iii) Sutrapur-Nayabazar-Gulistan; and (iv) Khilgaon-Mugdha-Bashabo. It will also pilot interventions for safe mobility and traffic management and incorporate environment-friendly features and energy efficient design principles and materials in all interventions that it will support.

## 2. Subproject Description

The DSCC has identified 6 roads under one package (Package No. DCNUP/W-16/KB) named “Road Improvement in Shahid Baki, Shantipur, Mugda goli and Bashabo Area” at Khilgaon-Mugda-Bashabo neighborhood under Zone-2 of DSCC for implementation under the project. The subproject includes improvement of Shahid Baki Road and Footpath, Bhuiyan Math Area Road, Goran Road, Shantipur School to Chapra Mosque Road, Shobujbagh Thana Area Roads and South Mugda Goli roads under this project.

Shahid Baki Road and Footpath is located in Ward No. 1 of DSCC. The carriage-way of Shahid Baki Road is a four-lane road with a discontinuous footpath on both sides. Medians are used only in street junctions to assign a degree of control to vehicles. The road lacks designated parking and drop-off provisions. Growth of mixed-used development is the current trend of Shahid Baki Road. Ground floors of the multi-storeyed buildings mostly accommodate different types of retail shops accessed directly from the street. Part of the street is famous for food stores. Vegetation is significantly grown and many mature trees are located on both sides of Shahid Baki Road. However, most of them are ‘Invasive type’ trees that are not suitable for

streets. The area is enriched with many schools and colleges, small factories, shops, and many more business establishments. There is historical/heritage site/buildings like Buddha Mondir within 2 kilometers of subproject area. Water logging is a major problem for the community people due to proper drainage system. In some places the community people has blocked the drainage system.

Bhuiyan Math Area Road, Goran Road, Shantipur School to Chapra Mosque Road is located in Ward No. 2 of DSCC. The Bhuiyan Math Road is a neighborhood road, which represent mainly as a narrow road at neighborhood scale with varying width. Footpath is absent along this road. This road is mainly used for local movements by pedestrians, rickshaws, CNG-run auto rickshaws and a few private cars. No commercial activity is found on this road, except the moving carts, which are selling daily perishable food items. Vegetation is almost indistinguishable along is roads. The Goran Road is mainly a narrow road at neighborhood scale with varying widths. Footpath is almost absent along the road. This road is mainly used for local movements by pedestrians, rickshaws, CNG-run auto rickshaws; and a few private cars. Except an old Banyan tree, the area is harsh without any plantation and greenery. Goran Road holds commercial functions, particularly local shops. Besides, a daily bazaar is found serving the community on mobile carts although not recognized by the authority as a formal approach. Shantipur School to Chapra Mosque Road, a narrow road, which is mainly a neighborhood road with varying widths. Footpath is almost absent along this road. This road is mainly used for local movements by pedestrians, rickshaws, CNG-run auto rickshaws; and a few private cars. Due to absence of safe pedestrian zone, local social interactions are negligible at street level. Shantipur School to Chapra Mosque Road holds a number of commercial functions, particularly local shops in the ground level of houses. Besides, there are a few religious and institutional facilities only.

Shobujbagh Thana Area Roads are located in Ward No. 4 of DSCC. The roads under Shobujbagh Thana Area are part of a planned layout with grid-iron pattern. These are approached from an arterial road, named Atish Dipanker Road, and give access to adjacent areas in Bashabo. The width of the roads is medium having footpaths in some parts. These roads are mainly used for local movements by pedestrians, rickshaws, CNG-run auto rickshaws and a few private cars. As the frequency of very low in some segments, children are found occupying the roads for playing and other social activities. Buildings along the Shobujbagh Thana Area Roads are mostly residential with some religious and institutional facilities only.

The South Mugda Goli is located in Ward No. 6 of DSCC. The South Mugda Goli is a narrow lane having 2-3-meter width allowing mainly pedestrians with some carts and bikes. South Mugda Goli is mainly a residential area devoid of any type of local institutions. The environment is very dull and harsh with no vegetation on the street level. The land that is proposed for subproject is under jurisdiction of DSCC. The

subprojects activities include lighting facilities, improved drainage system, at grade footpath, new carpeting road and culvert extension for Bhuian Math Area Road, Goran Road and Shantipur Road. For Shahid Baki Road and Footpath, the design team has incorporated street lighting, wider footpath with covered drain, urban design with plantation, median and loading/unloading zone.

The design team has incorporated lighting facilities, improved drainage system, at grade footpath, new carpeting road and culvert extension at Bhuian Math Area Road, Goran Road and Shantipur Road. For Shahid Baki Road Footpath, the design team has incorporated street lighting, wider footpath with covered drain, urban design with plantation, median and loading / unloading zone. For Narrow Street around Shobujbag Thana Area, the design team has incorporated street light, new RCC road and improved drainage system.

The neighborhood and subproject activities in the neighborhood were identified and designed in consultation with and participation of the local communities irrespective of gender, age, education and social status. The subproject location was selected considering the following issues:

- Due to unplanned development and lack of services in the roads, the total drainage system & its maintenance is major threat to its longevity. These conditions result into water logging & flooding. In all cases, open drains are common. However, sometimes drains are covered with moveable slabs, whereas, some drains are covered with permanent pavements inserted with grills to collect surface run-off. The maintenance of underground drains is very poor and water clogging during heavy rainfall is a common problem. If drainage system of the roads are constructed, the living condition of the local community will be improved and water logging problem will be decreased.
- Due to lack of sufficient width of roads, provision of footpath is absent in many parts of selected roads. As pavements at any level is not present, pedestrian lacks due possession on their roads. In some parts raised footpath is found, although discontinuous and of varying heights and widths. If footpath is improved, the pedestrians especially the women, physically challenged persons, children and senior citizens would be able to move easily.
- The roads often lack sufficient light that hamper personal security of the pedestrians on streets. If streetlight is improved, the pedestrians will enjoy a secured life during movement at night.
- There is no children playground in this area. Under this subproject, two silent roads will be improved considering children playground and easy movement for women which will help to develop their physical as well as mental health.

- The narrow streets have no plantation on their sides to provide shade for comfort and visual pleasure to users. Under the subproject, flowering plants will be planted in hanging pots to improve attractiveness and climatic comfort.

### 3. The Subprojects Area

The proposed 6 roads are located in Ward No. 1, 2, 4 and 6 at Khilgaon-Mugda-Bashabo neighborhood under the Zone-2 of DSCC.

Improvement and Construction works of Shahid Baki Road and Footpath is located in the Khilgaon-Mugda-Bashabo neighbourhood under Ward No. 1 of the DSCC. Khilgaon-Mugda-Bashabo is bounded by DNCC on the North, Shahjahanpur Police Station on the South, Ramna Police Station and Paltan Police Station on the East, Motijheel Police Station on the West. The area is enriched with many schools and colleges, small factories, shops, and many more business establishments. There is historical/heritage site/buildings like Buddha Mondir within 2 kilometers of subproject area.

Improvement and Construction works of Bhuian Math Area Road, Goran Road and Shantipur Road is located in the Khilgaon-Mugda-Bashabo neighbourhood under Ward No. 2 of the DSCC. Khilgaon-Mugda-Bashabo is bounded by DNCC on the North, Shahjahanpur Police Station on the South, Ramna Police Station and Paltan Police Station on the East, Motijheel Police Station on the West. The area is enriched with many schools and colleges, small factories, shops, and many more business establishments. There is historical/heritage site/buildings like Buddha Mondir within 500 meters of subproject area.

Improvement and Construction of Narrow Street around Shobujbagh Thana Area is located in the Khilgaon-Mugda-Bashabo neighbourhood under Ward No. 4 of the DSCC. Khilgaon-Mugda-Bashabo is bounded by DNCC on the North, Shahjahanpur Police Station on the South, Ramna Police Station and Paltan Police Station on the East, Motijheel Police Station on the West. The area is enriched with many schools and colleges, small factories, shops, and many more business establishments. There is historical/heritage site/buildings like Buddha Mondir within 2 kilometers of subproject area.

Improvement and Construction works of South Mugda Goli Road is located in the Khilgaon-Mugda-Bashabo neighbourhood under Ward No. 6 of the DSCC. The area is bounded by DNCC on the North, Shahjahanpur Police Station on the South, Ramna Police Station and Paltan Police Station on the East, Motijheel Police Station on the West. The area is enriched with many schools and colleges, small factories, shops, and many more business establishments.

The subproject is located in the Khilgaon-Mugda-Bashabo neighbourhood under Ward No. 1, 2, 4 and 6 of the DSCC. According to the BBS (Bangladesh Bureau of Statistics)-2011, the total area of Ward No. 1 is

4.08 sq. kilometer and there are 15,532 households. The Ward has 68,931 residents of whom 36,872 are male and 32,059 are female. The literacy rate of the Ward is 79.9% and sex ratio is 115. The population density ratio of the Ward is 84,389 in per sq. kilometer. According to Social Welfare Department, there are 378 physically challenged persons in the Ward. Among them, 240 are male and 138 are female. The total area of Ward No. 2 is 1.03 sq. kilometer and there are 26,869 households. The Ward has 113,273 residents of whom 59,610 are male and 53,663 are female. The literacy rate of the Ward is 78.5% and sex ratio is 111. The population density ratio of the Ward is 109,274 in per sq. kilometer. According to Social Welfare Department, there are 423 physically challenged persons in the Ward. Among them, 250 are male and 173 are female. According to the BBS -2011, the total area of Ward No. 4 is .98 sq. kilometer and there are 19,064 households. The Ward has 60,788 residents of whom 43,167 are male and 39,534 are female. The literacy rate of the Ward is 79.5% and sex ratio is 109. The population density ratio of the Ward is 84,389 in per sq. kilometer. According to Social Welfare Department, there are 354 physically challenged persons in the Ward. Among them, 223 are male and 131 are female. According to the BBS -2011, the total households of Ward No. 6 is 18,064. The Ward has 79,305 residents of whom 42,268 are male and 34,037 are female. The literacy rate of the Ward is 72% and sex ratio is 133. As per BBS (2011), the area has total 322,297 residents. The average literacy rate of the area is 77.4%. Considering 1.2 % inflation rate for per year, the total population of 2021 is approximately 367,486 (Ward No. 1 is 78,595; Ward No. 2 is 129,155; Ward No. 4 is 69311 and Ward No. 6 is 90,424). These 367,486 people will directly or indirectly use the roads of the subproject.

There are landowners and tenants in the locality. There are also many educational institutions, small factories, shops, and many more business establishments in the subproject area.

#### **4. The Subprojects Design**

The total length of Shahid Baki Road and Footpath is 1520 meters. Civil works include improvement and construction of footpath. Pipe drains will be installed under the street and urban lighting will be improved on the center and sides of the road. Community notice boards will be introduced to act as reference point in streets. Moreover, flowering plants will be planted in hanging pots to improve attractiveness and climatic comfort. Street bins will be organized to create awareness among the community for public health and hygiene. Physical expansion of the roads is not possible due mainly to compact settlement and high price of land along the roadside.

The total length of Bhuiyan Math Area Road is 225 meters. Under the improvement works of this road, side drains will be removed in favor of the central pipe drain. Urban lighting will be improved with light poles. Community notice boards will be introduced to act as reference point in streets. Moreover, flowering

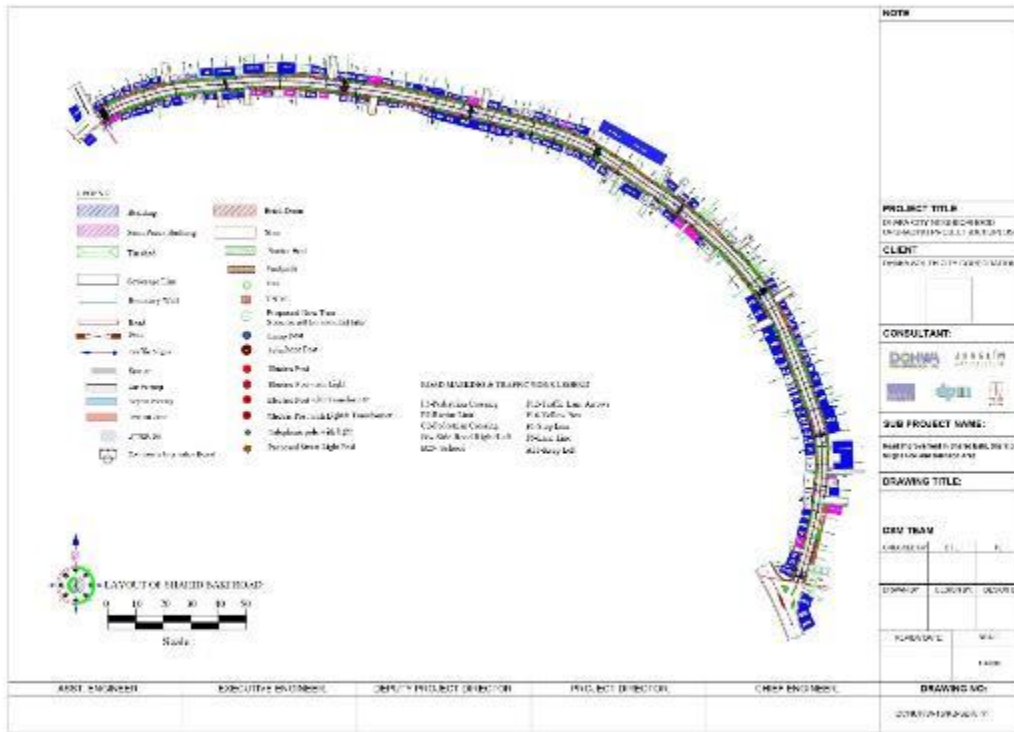
plants will be planted in hanging pots to improve attractiveness and climatic comfort. Street bins will be organized to create awareness among the community for public health and hygiene.

The total length of Goran road is 1160 meters. Under the improvement works of this, road will be renovated. The wall around the open space will be removed, adding a row of trees, urban furniture and street lighting instead. Community notice boards will be introduced to act as reference point in streets. Moreover, flowering plants will be planted in hanging pots to improve attractiveness and climatic comfort. Street bins will be organized to create awareness among the community for public health and hygiene.

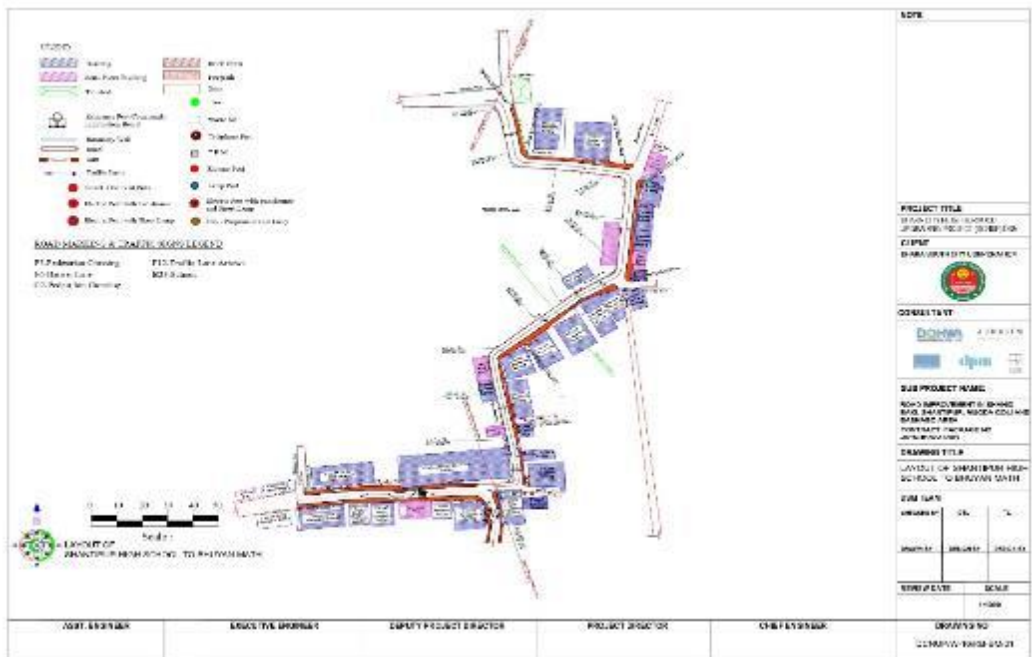
The total length of Shantipur School to Chapra Mosque Road is 960 meters. Under the improvement works of this road, a new pavement will be built, keeping the street “curb less”, with no differentiated sidewalks. Street lighting will be improved to increase its uniformity. Community notice boards will be introduced to act as reference point in streets. Moreover, flowering plants will be planted in hanging pots to improve attractiveness and climatic comfort. Street bins will be organized to create awareness among the community for public health and hygiene.

The total length of Shobujbagh Thana Area Roads is 500 meters. Under the improvement works of these roads, different streets that compose this sub-project will be treated according to their own character and needs. Side drains will be removed and a continuous concrete pavement will be built. Pedestrian areas will be created with an asymmetric “curb less” design and distinct pedestrian pavements. Street lighting will be improved in all roads increasing its uniformity, and integrating it between the trees or on the facades. Community notice boards will be introduced to act as reference point in streets. Moreover, flowering plants will be planted in hanging pots to improve attractiveness and climatic comfort. Street bins will be organized to create awareness among the community for public health and hygiene. Two silent roads will be improved considering children playground and easy movement for women.

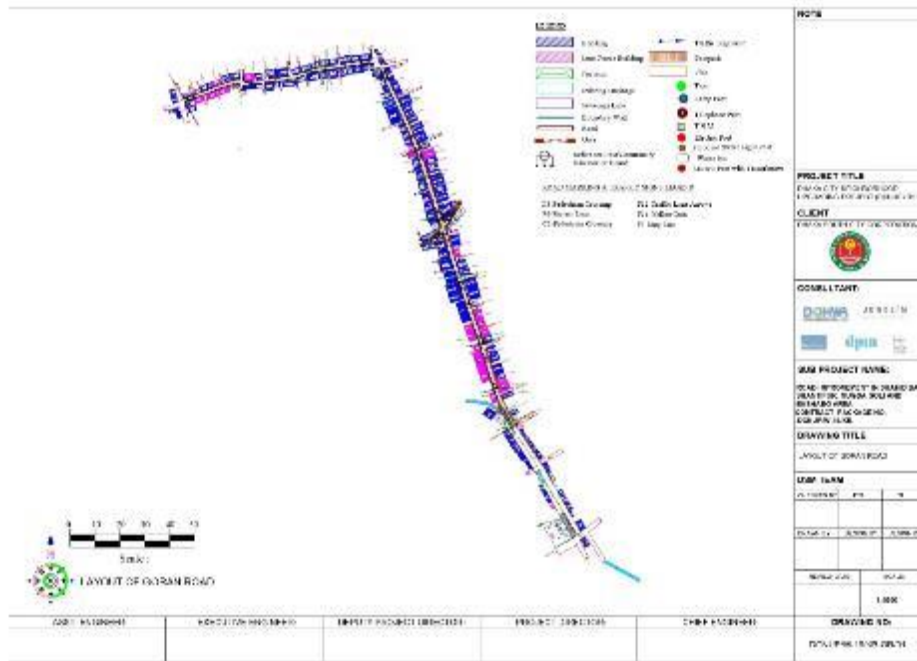
The total length of South Mugda Goli is 145 meters. For South Mugda Goli roads, side drains will be removed and a continuous concrete pavement will be built. Street lighting will be improved. Community notice boards will be introduced to act as reference point in streets. Moreover, flowering plants will be planted in hanging pots to improve attractiveness and climatic comfort. Street bins will be organized to create awareness among the community for public health and hygiene.



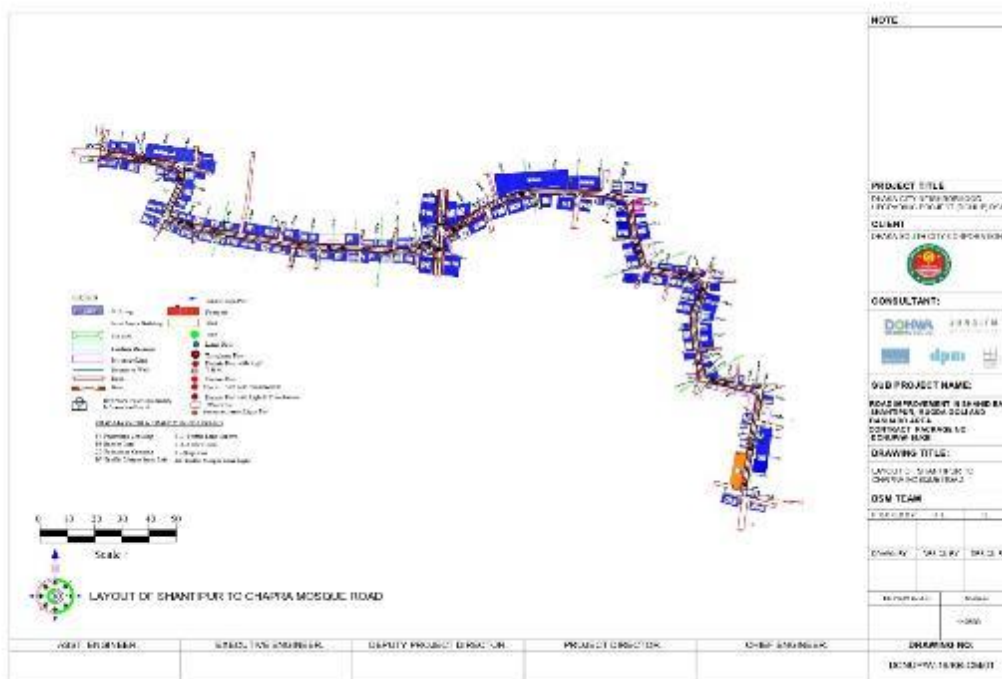
**Figure 1:** Proposed Layout Plan of Shahid Baki Road and Footpath

**Figure 3: Proposed Layout Plan of Goran road**

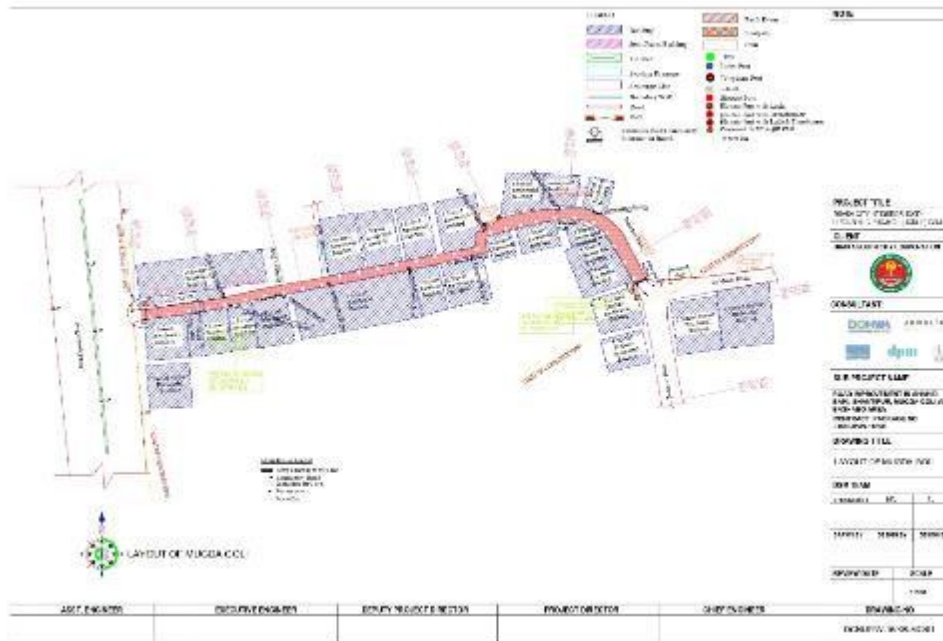


**Figure 4: Proposed Layout Plan of Shantipur School to Chapra Mosque Road**

## 5. Social Risks and Safeguards Impacts

- During consultation, the stakeholders raised no major risk issues. The impacts the stakeholders raised are dust and sound pollution. The stakeholders apprehended that during construction works additional dust could be created and noise could cross its limit. The DSCC has committed the stakeholders to instruct the Civil Contractor to spray water during construction to reduce dust and to initiative to reduce sound pollution.
- The social screening confirmed that this Works Packages (W-16/KB) does not have any involuntary resettlement impacts. So, no Resettlement Plan will therefore be required as per requirement of the Resettlement Policy Framework (RPF) adopted for the project. **Appendix A** provides the social screening results. Social issues like community participation in identification and design was followed in the subproject identification and design process. The consultation and participation process covered communities from all available groups, men, women, elderly, vulnerable and the elite.
- The community may, however, suffer construction related risks and impacts including temporary restriction on movement, traffic congestion, noise, dust and labor influx including risks of gender based violence (GBV) differently experienced by men and women but as the subproject activities will be within an urban area with closer supervision by the PIU, DSCC and DSM Consultant, the risks of labor influx and GBV will be very low.

## 6. Cut Off date

The Subprojects, W-16/KB of Dhaka City Neighborhood Upgrading Project (DCNUP) of Dhaka South City Corporation (DSCC) will be implemented in six roads. No unauthorized occupants were found during social screening. The social screenings of 6 roads were done on November 10, 2020 (Social Screening Report is attached as Annex C) with participation of the respected councilors and the community people and the date was declared as Cut-off date for the respective Ward for recognition of any affected persons due to design and implementation of the subprojects. It was declared among the communities during consultation that any unauthorized encroachment into the proposed location for any activity afterwards would not be considered for compensation under the project.

## 7. Disclosure and Consultation

Two rounds of consultation were carried out for each subproject with the community people. During the preparatory stage of the subproject, objectives and implementation approach of the subproject, neighborhood selection criteria, subproject identification criteria, and social requirements including safeguards, inclusion, participation, gender and disability issues, GBV risks, labor influx issues were discussed with the community people. The PIU of DCNUP, DSCC and the Zone Office 2 carried out the

consultation for identification and design of these subprojects with the help of local Councilors. The representation in the consultation process was all-inclusive and participatory. A total of 152 (One hundred and fifty two) potential users/community people, men, women, students, sports organizer, vulnerable groups, senior citizens and businessmen were consulted in the consultation meetings (proceedings are attached as **Appendix-C**). Existing problems of the community people and possible construction and rehabilitation measures were discussed in the meeting for feedback from the communities. Different social risks during and after implementation of the subprojects were also consulted with the participants.

During the design preparatory stage, the PIU conducted three stakeholder's consultations for improvement in Shahid Baki, Shantipur, Mugda goli and Bashabo Area. The consultation meetings were inclusive (meeting minutes is attached). The stakeholders have placed their suggestions during consultation meeting. First stakeholders' consultation was held on April 4, 2021 at Bhuian Math, Goran under the Ward No. 2 of the DSCC to know and receive suggestions and desire of the local people about Improvement and Construction works of Bhuian Math Area Road and Bhuian Math Area and Other works and Shantipur Road. The participants suggested not expanding the width of the road, as there are lots of high-rise building adjacent to the said roads. They have also demanded sufficient lighting facilities, tree plantation, underground utility facilities and improved drainage system. Second consultation was held on April 4, 2021 at Blue Moon Restaurant and Party Center, Taltola More under the Ward No. 1 of the DSCC to know and receive suggestions and desire of the local people about Improvement and Construction works of Shahid Baki Road and Footpath. The participants have suggested for planting trees, CCTV system for the safety and security, speed breaker, sufficient lighting facilities, developed drainage system and underground utility facilities. Third stakeholders' consultation was held on May 24, 2021 at Bashabo Community Center, Uttar Bashabo under the Ward No. 4 of the DSCC to know and receive suggestions and desire of the local people about Improvement and Construction of Narrow Street around Bashabo Thana Area and South Mugda Goli. The participants suggested for RCC pipe drain instead of open side drain, sufficient lighting, passenger shed, toilet facilities, tree plantation and rickshaw stand at designated points .

During the appraisal stage, the PIU also conducted three stakeholder's consultations for improvement in Shahid Baki, Shantipur, Mugda goli and Bashabo Area to appraise the stakeholders about the design that was developed considering their suggestions. In the design preparatory stage there were 152 participants and in the appraisal stage there were 174 participants. The participants who provided their opinions in the consultation meeting during preparatory stage, among them about 51.31% (78 participants) of the participants were present in the appraisal stage. All the stakeholders including the respected Councilor (100% attendees) appreciated the design and expressed their satisfaction saying that the design will serve their desire purpose (Meeting minutes and attendance are attached as **Appendix-C**). All the construction works will be carried out involving stakeholders as well as considering their recommendations.

## **8. Social Management Plan**

### **8.1 Objectives and Principles**

The subproject activities will not involve any acquisition of land or involuntary displacement of people, either physically or economically, temporarily or permanently. Other social risks including social exclusion, gender discrimination, community engagement, labor influx and GBV, other construction related impacts including temporary restriction on movement, traffic congestion, dust and sound pollution will be managed under the subprojects Social Management Plan (SMP).

The principles, guidelines, and procedures provided in this SMP are intended to ensure that the subproject activities have been identified and designed and will be implemented following approach to achieve the following objectives:

- a. Enhance positive social outcomes of the activities financed under the DCNUP;
- b. Ensure participation of the target communities, including women and disadvantaged, while identifying the specific measures/activities for adaptation to the development work impacts;
- c. Prevent or compensate for loss of livelihood, which may result from land-based adaptation activities and use of common property resources;
- d. Ensure compliance with the relevant government policies and those of the World Bank on social safeguards and other social issues, including those with gender implications.

### **8.2 Community Participation during Implementation**

The PIU of DSCC conducted stakeholders consultation meetings during design stage and appraisal stage of the subproject for improvement of roads under the subproject and accordingly designed the same considering all the feasible options obtained from the community in the consultation process. During the consultation, the stakeholders and citizens demanded not to expand the width of the road as there are lots of high-rise building adjacent to the said roads and DCNUP has not expand the width of the roads; the participants demanded sufficient lighting facilities and DCNUP has provided sufficient lighting facilities in all roads; the participants demanded tree plantation and DCNUP has designed flowering plants in hanging pots in all roads; the participants demanded improved drainage system (RCC pipe drain instead of open side drain) and DCNUP has designed improved covered drainage system in all roads. The participants suggested to take initiatives to control dust and sound during construction period and DCNUP will give instructions to civil contractor to take proper measures to control dust and sound during construction period. All the construction works will be carried out involving stakeholders as well as considering their recommendations.

**Community participation approach in the implementation process:** During the implementation of the subproject, the DSM Consultant with the help of PIU will further engage communities in the subproject level inclusive of age, gender and social status and carry out consultation meetings with them on regular basis to incorporate their feedback. The participants will be of the community peoples including senior citizens, community associations, businessmen, students, women and disadvantaged to seek their participation and feedback in quality control and smooth implementation of the subprojects activities. The local councilors will help to organize the community people and the Zone Office 2 of DSCC and the consultants will facilitate, document and disclose the consultation proceedings. The consultation process and feedback will be reported in the monthly social safeguard monitoring report to share with the Bank.

### **8.3 Gender, Age and Disability Inclusion**

The subproject design considered gender, age and disability of community people based on consultation and participation inclusive of age, gender and physical ability. During consultation meetings, female participants were also attended. The DSM Consultant with the help of PIU, DSCC in the subproject implementation process, will engage communities inclusive of age, gender and disability to gather their respective views and preferences to integrate in subproject civil works construction. The subproject activities have been designed to ensure participation of the local residents, women, children including girls, senior citizens, and physically challenged persons. The design team has incorporated universal accessibility footpaths to move ups and downs the sidewalk with wheel chairs. Moreover, tactile paving tiles will be used in making middle part of the footpath for the visually impaired people to walk safely during movement. The DSCC will ensure that women are involved in civil works construction and they enjoy (i) equal pay for equal work; (ii) gender friendly work environment; and (iii) work place safety for women and children.

### **8.4 Labor Influx and GBV Risks Management**

The project is being implemented in the Capital City of Dhaka and the DSCC will apply its current capacity enhanced with supervision consultants for civil works supervision. Number of workers will be low in the construction site and all will be locally recruited. The risks of labor influx and GBV will therefore be very low and also be managed with close supervision against laborers code of conduct. The PIU will instruct the civil contractor and subcontractors to engage local labor as many as possible and build makeshift toilets and sanitation system in the construction area to ensure safe and healthy working environment. The contractor will also be asked to take safely measures during construction. The PIU will follow and the civil contractor will ensure that the influx of workers and followers cannot lead to any social and environmental impacts on local communities. Before engagement in civil works, the labors will be given an orientation/training. Their activities will be regularly monitored by the contractor, DSM Consultant and PIU will incorporate in the monthly safeguard monitoring report and submit to the World Bank. A Code of

Conduct will be developed and will be signed by all workers in this regard. Workers will also be trained so as to deter any case of GBV/SEA/SH.

Severity of the risks of labor influx varies for community absorption capacity, number of laborers in a worksite and the duration of civil works construction. The risk is assessed to be low as the numbers of workers will be small compared to the size of the host community, the site is in an urban area with high absorption capacity and law-enforcement is strong. The PIU, DSCC will however, conduct site specific labor influx screening and assessment to identify related risks for management. The civil contractor concerned will develop Contractor's Environmental and Social Management Plan (C-ESMP) following the project EMF and RPF and report its implementation status regularly to the PIU. The PIU, however, will include labor related information and update in their regular project progress reports.

### **8.5 Grievance Management**

A two-tier Grievance Redress Mechanism (GRM) has been established for the subproject including; (i) Ward Level GRM (Tier one) and (ii) Project level GRM (Tier two). Tier two GRM receives complaints and grievances those cannot be resolved at the tier one GRM. Responsible Executive Engineer has been assigned as the convener of the Ward level GRM, while the Project Director at PIU is the chair of the project level GRM. A five-member Grievance Redress Committee (GRC) at the Ward level has already been formed and authorized to deal with all suggestions and complaints at the Ward level. The DSCC has ensured that communities are fully informed about the GRM and their rights to offer suggestions and make complaints, and the different mechanisms through which they can do so. As the concentration of subprojects is within the city, the secretariat of both GRM are at PIU HQ. GRC may sit on any grievances and suggestions from the communities at the ward level locally or in the office of the ward councilor or at the PIU HQ.

The membership of the GRC ensures representation of complaints and grievances as well as impartial hearings and investigations, and transparent resolutions. The GRC Convener requests the concerned Ward Councilor from which the complaint was received to participate in the hearing. If the aggrieved person is a female, GRC requests the concerned female Ward Councilor to participate in the hearings.

All complaints are received at the Zone Office of DSCC, where the subproject is located and registered in the complaint book with instant intimation to the complainant. Complaints are investigated and heard within 15 days of registration and resolved in the third week of the receipt. GRC decisions, if agreed by the complainant is binding upon the PIU.

## 9. Implementation, Monitoring and Evaluation

The DSCC will ensure that implementation of activities outlined in this SMP are implemented and followed in the subproject civil works process. Social inclusion, gender mainstreaming and management of other social risks and impacts identified and managed as above, will be monitored in line with the social analysis of inclusion and participation of various groups/agencies including women and consistent with the activities/issues that have been integrated into project design. The DSCC will monitor the issues on a regular basis and include the results in the monthly and quarterly reports and also submit to the World Bank.

Depending on the project contents and objectives, subproject indicators for evaluation should take into account, among other relevant aspects, the following points:

- Specific needs of community people including affected and beneficiary groups irrespective of gender and incorporation of them into subprojects implementation approach.
- Local knowledge and inputs for enhancement of subprojects outcomes.
- Intended and unintended social and gender effects of the subprojects.

Lessons and good practices to be drawn from the monitoring process which can help mainstreaming gender and inclusion of community people in project design and implementation in the subsequent identification, design and implementation of subprojects and any future projects.

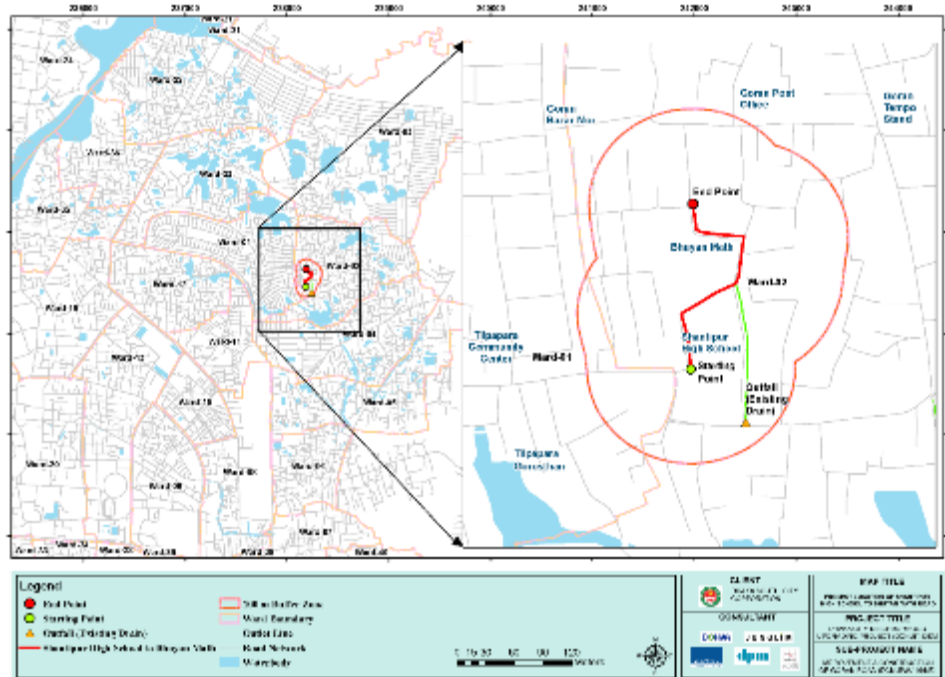

## **Appendix-B: COVID-19 Protocols to be followed at Construction Site**

Considering the COVID-19 pandemic across the world, it is important to take into consideration and alert for preparation and implementation of any project. For ensuring the health security following standard guidelines for Office and Field Work during COVID-19 Pandemic are proposed:

### **A. Pre-cautionary measures for participant during meeting, training session or public gathering**

- All Participants (men, women and children) must wear mask.
- Participant's mask must cover always his/her nose and mouth during the meeting, training session or public gathering.
- Participant who is sick by fever, cold, cough, sore throat, having breathlessness must prohibit attending in the meeting.
- Participant whose family member(s) tested Corona Positive must not be invited and prohibited to attend in the meeting, training session or public gathering.
- Participant who/whose family member(s) recently transferred to the home from other district, country or long journey by public transport must not be invited and prohibited to attend in the meeting, training session or public gathering.
- Participant who/whose family member(s) recently visited or touched to the Corona Positive patient or attended the funeral of a Corona positive death but did not stayed in 14 days home quarantine must not be attended in the meeting, training session or public gathering.
- The sitting arrangement of the training room must ensure U shape keeping Social Distancing at least 3.2 feet/1 meter from each participant.
- Facilities for washing hand and face must ensure in the meeting, training session or gathering room/yard/area. Participant must enter the session after washing his/her hand and face by using soap water or hand sanitizer.

### **B. Pre-cautionary measures for Survey Team during survey conduction**

- Must wear mask and hand gloves during survey. At best wearing Personal Protective Equipment (PPE). The mask must be at least 3 layers.
- Must use official transport or private vehicle *i.e.* bi-cycle, motorbike. Best to avoid public transport.
- Before travelling, recommended to spray by using disinfectant in the official transport.
- Carry personal hand sanitizer. Use it intervallic during survey.
- Must maintain 3.2 feet/1 meter social distance if the survey conduct face-to-face and the respondent also must wear mask as instructed. Survey conductor must be alert whether the responded physically risk or risky for Covid-19.

### **C. Pre-cautionary measures for Office Staff during office hours**

- Must use tissue or sanitized clean cloth or hand knee during sneezing.
- Don't throw waste in your work station. Use bin for waste management.
- Keep your shoes outside the office complex. Use shoe rack.
- Keep clean your desk/work station. Best to spray your surrounding by disinfectant.
- All staff must wear mask all time.
- Alert to touch contaminated surface.
- Maintain social distancing with your colleague during work. Set your desk maintaining social distance.
- Employees who have returned from an area where COVID-19 is spreading should monitor themselves for symptoms for 14 days and take their temperature twice a day.
- Always disinfect your personal pocket materials *i.e.* money bag, vanity bag, sun glass, mobile phone, home key and ATM card.
- Be alert using office common wash room and toilet. Spray with disinfectant onto washroom basin, toilet before and after using them. Clean them at least three time by using toilet cleaner.

### **D. Pre-cautionary measures to follow at workplaces**

#### **➤ Physical distancing**

- Measures will be taken to keep a distance of at least 1 meter between people and avoid direct physical contact with other persons (hugging, touching, shaking hands), strict control over external access, queue management (marking on the floor, barriers);
- Reduce density of people in the building (no more than 1 person per every 10 square meters), physical spacing at least 1 meter apart for work stations and common spaces, such as entrances/exits, where congregation or queuing of employees or visitors/clients might occur will be ensured;
- Non-essential travel to work sites will be prohibited;
- Workers will be sensitized with one-to-one meeting or publication materials to comply with instructions from the government relating to COVID-19;
- Workers will be sensitized with one-to-one meeting or publication materials on whom to contact if they feel ill while at work;

- Workers will be monitor before appoint for work through medical professional if he/she is infected with COVID-19 or bearing symptom of fever and cough themselves for symptoms for 14 days;
- Thermal screening at the workplace will be introduced;
- Temperature of all the workers and staff will be monitored twice a day and they will be urged to self-monitor their health;
- If they feel unwell, they will be advised to stay at home, self-isolation, and contact a medical professional; and
- The local health authorities will be contacted to keep attendance and meeting records in order to facilitate or undertake contact-tracing.

➤ **Hygiene**

- Regular and thorough handwashing with soap and water or hand hygiene with alcohol-based hand-rub before starting work, before eating, frequently during the work shift, especially after contact with co-workers or customers, after going to the bathroom, after contact with secretions, excretions and body fluids, after contact with potentially contaminated objects (gloves, clothing, masks, used tissues, waste), and immediately after removing gloves and other protective equipment but before touching eyes, nose, or mouth;
- Hand hygiene stations, such as hand washing and hand rub dispensers, should be put in prominent places around the workplace and be made accessible to all labors, staff, contractors, clients or visitors along with communication materials to promote hand hygiene;
- Medical face masks and paper tissues will be made available at the workplace, for those who develop a runny nose or cough at work, along with bins with lids for hygienic disposal;
- Wearing mask or face covering for all labors, staff, contractors, clients or visitors will be ensured;
- It will be ensured that any sick worker not come to work; and
- If a member of staff or a worker feels unwell while at work, he/she should be provided with a medical mask so that he/she may get home safely.

## ➤ **Communication**

The alternate approaches that will be practiced for stakeholder engagement will include:

- Minimizing the need for physical meetings, teleconferencing facilities will be introduced;
- Consultations in small groups will be arranged if smaller meetings are permitted;
- Efforts to conduct meetings through online channels (WebEx, Zoom, Skype, Google Meet, Google Classroom etc.) will be introduced;
- Diversify means of communication like social media, chat groups, dedicated online platforms and mobile Apps (Facebook, Twitter, WhatsApp groups, project web links/websites, etc.) will be introduced;
- Local channels of communications such as cable TV, religious leaders like Imam of Mosjid, Porohit of Mondir and Father of Church, dedicated phone-lines, SMS broadcasting, and public announcements (miking) when stakeholders do not have access to online channels or do not use them frequently will be used;
- Posters, short videos, and electronic message boards will be introduced to increase awareness about COVID-19 among workers and local people; and
- Labors will be encourage through one-to-one meeting to use GRM.

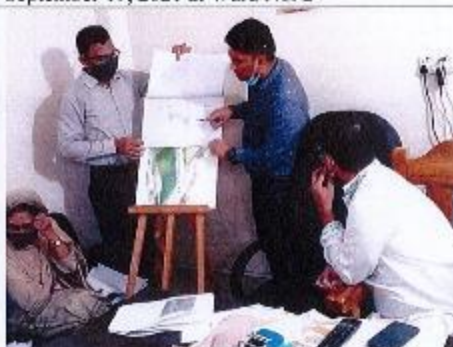

After completion of the presentation, the honorable Councilor, Mr. Md. Anisur Rahman has thanked the DSCC for developing the design considering the stakeholders' opinions provided in the design phase consultation meeting and expressed his happiness for holding such consultation meeting with design and drawing. He has expressed his satisfaction over the displayed design saying that despite some limitation the

DSCC has developed a unique design. He has also expressed the hope that the DSCC will start work in the shortest possible time to fulfill dream of the local people. He has mentioned that the electric poles are situated at the middle of roads and hampering vehicles and pedestrian movement. He has requested the DSCC to take step to remove the electric poles from the middle of the road. If it is done then it will widen the road and solve all the road related problems, he added. Mahbubul Alam, has chaired the meeting and Ms. Farhana Dolly, Female Ward Councilor (Reserve), Ward No. 1, 11 & 12, DSCC has co-chaired the meeting. Mr. Md. Mahbubul Alam has started the meeting with a welcome address and informed the participants about the agenda of the meeting. The honorable Councilor has conveyed thanks to the DSCC and the World Bank for holding such a consultation meeting to appraise the stakeholders. He has requested the design team to present detail of the design. Ms. Farhana Dolly, Female Ward Councilor (Reserve), has requested the participants to provide their feedback after presentation.

Consultation by Mr. Md. Mahbulul Alam, Ward Councilor, Ward No. 1, DSCC

The honorable Councilor has expressed his satisfaction over the displayed design saying that despite limitations the DSCC has developed a unique design. He has pointed out if the new drain is constructed like the current situation, our plan may not work fully. He has further pointed out that the current drain is filled with soil and is closed. So, drain construction plan should be changed into RCC drain, instead of brick drain, considering the current situation of the existing drain. He has opined that the manhole had previously been fitted with an iron lid, but this caused problems after rusting and trouble opening the lid. He has mentioned that the contractors, who work in our city, usually go to the construction work with a hoax. So he recommended that the construction work of the contractor should be closely monitored under this project. He has suggested that when planting trees, the soil must be prepared and planted deep in the soil. He has applauded that the plan given for the waste bins is very nice. He has demanded sufficient and proper lighting facilities in the roads for the safety and security of the pedestrian at night and improved drainage system;

The design team has replied to the opinion of Mr. Md. Mahbulul Alam saying that the drain under this project will be 1 (one) meter deep. They (the design team) have stated that the existing drain will be replaced by the new drain. They have informed the honorable Councilor that there will be operable RCC manhole covers every 6 meters of the drain. They have also informed the honorable Councilor that the project will provide the concrete slabs on drains and fix tiles on them. They have assured that tiles and concrete slabs will be standard. They have also assured the honorable Councilor that the DSCC will strongly monitor all activities of the project works. They have further assured that a Grievance Redress Mechanism (GRM) has already been action in the project. A Grievance Redress Committee (GRC) will be formed under this mechanism in the Ward for addressing the grievances if any. Male and Female Counselors both will be members of the GRC. If the contractor commits any irregularity in the work, there will be an opportunity to complain to the GRC. If this complaint cannot be resolved at the local level, then the complaint will be referred to the Project Office of DSCC for solving. The design team has informed that sufficient street lights are proposed in the design keeping the existing light and where necessary in the roads for the safety and security of the pedestrian at night. The design team has informed that seating arrangements will be set up where place is available on the footpath in front of the food corner. People will be able to sit and talk in the shed of trees there.

Consultation by Ms. Farhana Dolly, Female Ward Councilor (Reserve), Ward No. 1, 11 & 12, DSCC

Ms. Farhana Dolly has stated that when it rains a little, the Taltola road becomes flooded. She has also stated that we need to reconsider whether we should construct a cycle lane or not, but we have to make arrangements for cycle movement in parallel roads of Shahid Baki Road. She has requested for car parking space on this road. She has emphasized that all works should be started and completed as soon as possible.

The design team has replied to the statement of Ms. Farhana Dolly stating that there is no enough space for car parking in Shahid Baki Road. So only drop-off (from the car) arrangements have been made for this road.

Consultation by Mr. Awal Kamruzzaman Farid, Social Activist, Pallima Sangsad and a local resident, Ward No. 1, DSCC



Mr. Awal Kamruzzaman Farid has opined that no other type of car or even rickshaw can be kept in the cycle lane except cycle. He has mentioned that there is no arrangement for car parking. He has also mentioned that car parking should be introduced (if possible) for this area. He has emphasized making underground utility facilities in the area under this project.

The design team has replied to the opinion of Mr. Awal Kamruzzaman Farid that no other type of car can be kept on cycle lane except cycle. They also replied that as there is not enough space for car parking in Shahid Baki Road, so there is no opportunity for creating car parking. The design team also informed that there is no scope of underground utility facilities under this project.

Consultation by Mr. Humayun Kabir Azad, President, Khilgaon Taltola Super Market, Ward No. 1, DSCC

Mr. Humayun Kabir Azad has thanked the DSCC for developing the design and for arranging the appraisal level consultation meeting. He has suggested that if a divider is made in the middle of the road, it should be of a very thin size. Otherwise, due to the thick divider, the width of the road will be reduced and the traffic congestion will be increased. He has indicated that it would be great to have a sewerage line to coordinate with this project. He has identified that the plan of tree plantation is right.

The design team has responded to the view of Mr. Humayun Kabir Azad saying that the divider will be very narrow. They (the design team) have informed that work of sewerage line is not in this project. They have also informed that DWASA has a separate project for the sewerage line.

Consultation by Mr. Md. Harunur Rashid (Nipu), a businessman and local resident, Ward No. 1, DSCC

Mr. Md. Harunur Rashid (Nipu) has suggested that the development of road and footpath should be planned with a target of 50 to 100 years. Otherwise, the money of the project will be wasted.

The design team has replied to the opinion of Mr. Md. Harunur Rashid (Nipu) saying that the design team is trying to absolute utilization of the money of the project.

Consultation by Mr. Md. Khorshed Alam (Tapan), local resident, Ward No. 1, DSCC

Mr. Md. Khorshed Alam (Tapan) has said that the road cannot be narrowed. He has suggested that the depth of drainage should be increased and the flow of water in the drainage system should be kept running at all times. He has also suggested that the seating arrangement should be reconsidered for lack of social acceptance of the intruders sitting there, if possible.

The design team has replied to the statement and suggestion of Mr. Md. Khorshed Alam (Tapan) that road, drainage and footpath development will be done based on design concept focusing the streets as a determinant of neighborhoods health and wellbeing.

Consultation by Mr. Mazedul Alam Shuvo, a businessman and local resident, Ward No. 1, DSCC

Mr. Mazedul Alam Shuvo has thanked the design team of the project under DSCC for the presentation. He has pointed out that the drop-off (from car) system can be very troublesome. He has also pointed out that the cycle lane can be created a hazardous situation. He has specified that the local community is responsible for the waste and drainage problem. He has also specified that the local community has to maintain the road and footpath of our area.

The design team has replied to the discussion points of Mr. Mazedul Alam Shuvo saying that there will be drop-off only where the road is wide. They (the design team) have informed that the narrow part of the road





will not have any cycle lane but the wide part will have it. So, the cycle lane will not create a hazardous situation.

সিটি কর্পোরেশন সংক্রান্ত বিদ্যমান আইন ও অধ্যাদেশসমূহ একীভূত, অভিন্ন এবং সমন্বিতকরণকল্পে প্রণীত আইন

যেহেতু সিটি কর্পোরেশন সংক্রান্ত বিদ্যমান আইন ও অধ্যাদেশসমূহ একীভূত, অভিন্ন এবং সমন্বিতকরণকল্পে বিধান করা সমীচীন ও প্রয়োজনীয়;

সেহেতু এতদ্বারা নিম্নরূপ আইন করা হইল :—

প্রথম ভাগ  
প্রারম্ভিক

১। সংক্ষিপ্ত শিরোনাম ও প্রবর্তন।—(১) এই আইন স্থানীয় সরকার (সিটি কর্পোরেশন) আইন, ২০০৯ নামে অভিহিত হইবে।

(২) এই আইনের—

- (ক) ধারা ২৪, ৮২, ৮৩, ৮৪, ৮৫, ৮৬, ৮৭, ৮৮, ৮৯, ৯০, ৯২, ৯৩ এবং ১১৩ ব্যতীত অবশিষ্ট ধারাসমূহ ১৪ মে ২০০৮ খ্রিস্টাব্দ তারিখে কার্যকর হইয়াছে বলিয়া গণ্য হইবে; এবং
- (খ) ধারা ২৪, ৮২, ৮৩, ৮৪, ৮৫, ৮৬, ৮৭, ৮৮, ৮৯, ৯০, ৯২, ৯৩ এবং ১১৩ অবিলম্বে কার্যকর হইবে।

১৬.৫. যদি ভূমি উন্নয়ন প্রকল্পের বিধানের খেলাপ করিয়া কোন জায়গা উন্নয়ন করা হয়, তাহা হইলে কর্পোরেশন নোটিশ দ্বারা ভূমির মালিককে অথবা বিধান খেলাপকারী ব্যক্তিকে নোটিশে উল্লিখিতভাবে জায়গাটিতে পরিবর্তন সাধন করিবার জন্য নির্দেশ দিতে পারিবে; এবং যদি নির্দেশ মোতাবেক পরিবর্তন সাধন না করা হয়, অথবা পরিবর্তন সাধন করা সম্ভব না হয়, তাহা হইলে কর্পোরেশন প্রবিধান অনুসারে আপত্তিকর নির্মাণ কার্য ভাঙ্গিয়া ফেলিতে বা ভাঙ্গিয়া ফেলিবার নির্দেশ দিতে পারিবে এবং অন্য কোন আইনে যাহা কিছুই থাকুক না কেন উক্তরূপ ভাঙ্গিয়া ফেলিবার জন্য কোন ক্ষতিপূরণ প্রদেয় হইবে না।

১৬.৬. যদি ভূমি উন্নয়ন প্রকল্পের অন্তর্ভুক্ত কোন ভূমির, প্রকল্প নির্ধারিত সময়ের মধ্যে, উন্নয়ন সাধন করা না হয় এবং কর্পোরেশন তজ্জন্য সময় বর্ধিত না করে অথবা ভূমির উন্নয়ন উক্ত প্রকল্পের সহিত সামঞ্জস্যপূর্ণ না হয়, তাহা হইলে কর্পোরেশন প্রবিধান অনুসারে ভূমি উন্নয়নের ভার স্বয়ং গ্রহণকরতঃ প্রয়োজনীয় নির্মাণ কাজ সম্পন্ন করিতে পারিবে, এবং কর্পোরেশন কর্তৃক ব্যয়িত অর্থ ভূমির মালিকের নিকট হইতে তাঁহার উপর এই আইনের অধীন আরোপিত কর হিসাবে আদায়যোগ্য হইবে।

#### ১৭. ইমারত নিয়ন্ত্রণ

##### ইমারত সম্পর্কিত প্রবিধান

১৭.১. যদি কর্পোরেশন কোন ইমারত বা উহার উপর স্থাপিত কোন কিছু ধ্বংসানু্য অবস্থায় পড়িবার আশংকা রহিয়াছে বলিয়া মনে করে কিংবা উহা কোন প্রকারে উহার বাসিন্দাদের অথবা উহার পার্শ্ববর্তী কোন ইমারত বা উহার বাসিন্দাদের বা পথচারীদের জন্য বিপজ্জনক বলিয়া মনে করে, তাহা হইলে কর্পোরেশন নোটিশ দ্বারা উহাতে উল্লিখিত প্রয়োজনীয় ব্যবস্থা গ্রহণ করিবার জন্য উক্ত ইমারতের মালিককে বা দখলকারকে নির্দেশ দিতে পারিবে, এবং যদি এই নির্দেশ পালনে কোন ত্রুটি হয় তাহা হইলে কর্পোরেশন নিজেই প্রয়োজনীয় পদক্ষেপ গ্রহণ করিতে পারিবে এবং এতদুদ্দেশ্যে ব্যয়িত অর্থ ইমারতের মালিকের নিকট হইতে তাঁহার উপর এই আইনের অধীনে আরোপিত কর হিসাবে আদায়যোগ্য হইবে।

১৭.২. যদি কোন ইমারত বিপজ্জনক অবস্থায় থাকে, বা উহা মানুষ বসবাসের অনুপযুক্ত হয় তাহা হইলে কর্পোরেশন উহার সম্ভ্রুটি মোতাবেক ইমারতটি মেরামত না করা পর্যন্ত উহাতে বসবাস নিষিদ্ধ করিতে পারিবে।

#### ১৮. রাস্তা

##### সাধারণের রাস্তা

১৮.১. কর্পোরেশন নগরীর অধিবাসী এবং নগরীতে আগন্তুকদের আরাম ও সুবিধার জন্য প্রয়োজনীয় রাস্তা এবং অন্যান্য যোগাযোগের ব্যবস্থা ও রক্ষণাবেক্ষণ করিবে।



**রাস্তা**

- ১৮.২. কর্পোরেশনের পূর্বনুমোদন ব্যতিরেকে এবং উক্ত অনুমোদনের শর্তানুযায়ী ব্যতীত কোন নতুন রাস্তা তৈয়ার করা যাইবে না।
- ১৮.৩. সাধারণের রাস্তা ব্যতীত অন্যান্য সকল রাস্তা প্রবিধান দ্বারা নির্ধারিত পদ্ধতিতে সংরক্ষিত হইবে।
- ১৮.৪. কর্পোরেশন নোটিশ দ্বারা, নোটিশে বর্ণিত পদ্ধতিতে কোন রাস্তা পাকা করা বা উহার পানি নিষ্কাশন বা উহার আলোর ব্যবস্থা করা বা অন্য কোন প্রকারে উহাকে উন্নত করিবার নির্দেশ দিতে পারিবে; এবং যদি উক্ত নির্দেশ অমান্য করা হয়, তাহা হইলে কর্পোরেশন স্বীয় এজেন্ট দ্বারা উক্ত কার্য সম্পাদন করাইতে পারিবে এবং ইহা বাবদ ব্যয়িত অর্থ সংশ্লিষ্ট ব্যক্তিদের নিকট হইতে তাহাদের উপর এই আইনের অধীন আরোপিত কর হিসেবে আদায়যোগ্য হইবে।

**রাস্তা সম্বন্ধে সাধারণ বিধানাবলী**

- ১৮.৫. কর্পোরেশন সরকারের পূর্বনুমোদনক্রমে যে কোন রাস্তার নাম করণ করিতে পারিবে এবং রাস্তার নাম উহার উপর বা উহার কোন মোড়ে কিংবা ইহার শেষ প্রান্তে বা প্রবেশ পথে পরিষ্কারভাবে ফলকে লিপিবদ্ধ করিতে হইবে।
- ১৮.৬. কোন ব্যক্তি কোন রাস্তা বা উহার নাম বা নাম ফলক বিনষ্ট বা ক্ষতিগ্রস্ত করিবে না কিংবা কর্পোরেশনের পূর্ব অনুমতি ব্যতীত উহার নাম ফলক অপসারণ করিবে না।
- ১৮.৭. কর্পোরেশন প্রবিধান দ্বারা নির্ধারিত পদ্ধতিতে রাস্তা ও ইমারত নির্মাণের সীমারেখা অঙ্কিত করিতে পারিবে এবং কোন রাস্তা বা ইমারত নির্মাণের ব্যাপারে এইরূপ সীমারেখা মানিয়া চলিবার নির্দেশ দিতে পারিবে।
- ১৮.৮. কর্পোরেশন প্রবিধান দ্বারা রাস্তার উপদ্রব এবং রাস্তা সংক্রান্ত ব্যাপারে অপরাধের সংজ্ঞা নিরূপণ করিতে পারিবে এবং উহা প্রতিরোধ ও দূরীকরণের জন্য ব্যবস্থা গ্রহণ করিতে পারিবে।

**অবৈধভাবে প্রবেশ**

- ১৮.৯. কর্পোরেশনের কোন রাস্তা, নর্দমা, ভূমি, বাড়ী, গলি বা পার্কে কর্পোরেশন কর্তৃক প্রদত্ত লাইসেন্স ব্যতিরেকে এবং উহার শর্তাবলী ব্যতীত কোন ব্যক্তি কোন প্রকারে অবৈধভাবে প্রবেশ করিবে না।
- ১৮.১০. উক্তরূপ অবৈধ পদার্পণ হইলে কর্পোরেশন নোটিশ দ্বারা নির্ধারিত সময়ের মধ্যে অবৈধ পদার্পণকারী ব্যক্তিকে তাহার অবৈধ পদার্পণ বন্ধ করিবার জন্য নির্দেশ দিতে পারিবে এবং উক্ত সময়ের মধ্যে যদি তিনি এই নির্দেশ মান্য না করেন তাহা হইলে কর্পোরেশন অবৈধ পদার্পণ বন্ধ করিবার জন্য যথযথ ব্যবস্থা গ্রহণ করিতে পারিবে এবং এই বাবদ যে ব্যয় হইবে তাহা উক্ত পদার্পণকারীর নিকট হইতে তাহার উপর এই আইনের অধীন আরোপিত কর হিসাবে আদায়যোগ্য হইবে।
